#### BETWEEN

#### INNATE TALENT and SARANATHAN COLLEGE OF ENGINEERING

#### 1. Scope:

This Memorandum of Understanding ("MOU") is entered into by and between INNATE TALENT, a Soft skills and Technical Skills Training & Development Academy, with its principal address at Plot no 60, Ram Nagar, Nalikkalpatty, Salem - 636201 (hereinafter called as Innate) and Saranathan College of Engineering, Trichy. (hereinafter called as Saranathan)

WHEREAS, this MOU is agreed between Innate and Saranathan, for the Training and Development activities for the engineering batch of 2021-2025 graduating in 2025 in the areas of Aptitude, Soft Skills & Technical skill development as agreed in the proposal / statement of work.

#### 2. Statement of work:

Innate Talent agrees to provide the services as described in the Proposal documents with the abstract as below;

#### 3. Executive Summary:

Program Highlights and Execution Strategy as Discussed:

- All results to be shared with the College
- Complete Online Testing Support
- Attendance to be tracked for all the sessions
- Have internal audits to improve the Delivery Quality

#### 4. Term of the MOU:

The term of this MOU shall commence on 26 December 2023 or the date on which both parties sign the contract, whichever date is later, and end on 31 May 2025, or until the MOU is terminated pursuant to the terms contained herein, whichever event occurs first.

#### 5. Responsibilities:

#### Innate agrees to:

1. Offer the training programs and competency development programs as prescribed in the proposals

- 2. Offer and execute the value additions / Benefits as stated in the Executive summary.
- 3. Supply the student with course training and evaluation materials.
- 4. Maintain student records on individuals for a minimum of 2 years or 1 year after the life of the MOU, whichever is greater. As a minimum, these records should contain the following: course title, hours of instruction, location, and dates; instructor(s) name(s), level of instructor certification, trainee details, progress & evaluation.
- 5. Change/modify the training time/duration to accommodate any changes in academic/college functions, with appropriate written (email) notice of 2 working days in advance in general and in special cases to a mutually agreeable shorter notice.
- 6. That in case an emergency change is made without prior notice, the right of suspension/re-plan for the cancelled session is at the discretion of Innate and the availability of resources.
- 7. Provide the college a written notification of course dates, time schedule, location, and lead instructor for all courses. Such notification shall be provided at least seven (7) calendar days in advance of the course starting date. When courses must be scheduled to meet emergency training needs, representatives from college and Innate may waive this seven (7) day notification. Requests for waiver may be made by email.
- 8. Verify instructor records to ensure that instructors meet or exceed standard qualifications.
- 9. Assure assessments Students Aptitude, Communication & Coding skills are administered properly and reported to the management for discussion.
- 10. To provide Saranathan with a relationship Officer/manager to handle the issues/escalations/discussions.
- 11. Any change in program/adjustment of Classroom sessions provided they will be intimated to both the parties (Innate & Saranathan), at appropriate notice in advance.
- 12. The college providing classroom for all the sessions.
- 13. Notifying well in advance any requirement of Seminar Halls with projector facility for delivering appropriate content for Soft skills/Industry interface/Guest lectures, preferably at the time of signing the MoU.
- 14. Saranathan mentioning/using Innate's name/Logo/Brand as their Training partner in brochures/Bill boards /hoardings/Advertisements/Website.
- 15. Innate using Saranathan's Brand/Logo in their client List.
- 16. Drafting separately as warranted a Statement of Work/Proposal for any other associative program envisaged.
- 17. Providing an option that the contract be renewed every year, upon Mutual Consent after completion of one year and regularised by a new agreement/MOU with satisfactory development in the students' skills, as assessed by a common methodology.

#### 6. Execution:

 The total training is for 25 to 28 days [Aptitude & Soft Skills – 13 Days + Technical Training – 12 Days + Complementary Attitude & Interview Skills (Students Development Program) – 02 Days (with a batch of 50 students) in a discrete manner of 2 to 3 programs a month starting from February 2024 to November 2024, for a total of 11 to 12 batches + Elite Batch Technical – 02 Days]. The training dates would be from January to May 2024 (for both Aptitude / Soft Skills and Technical Training). The schedule has been worked out on the assumption that there would be rescheduling based on major upcoming placements. Should there be any change in that schedule we may be forced to change above dates.

- Technical Training will be tentatively conducted from 17/01/2024 to 25/01/2024 (8 Days excluding Sunday) and from 29/01/2024 to 02/02/2024 (4 Days + 1 Day as Buffer). Aptitude & Soft Skills will be tentatively conducted before or after 6<sup>th</sup> Semester, whichever is feasible. Additional 02 Days for Elite Batch Training will be tentatively conducted in the month of February 2024, without affecting internal examinations.
- 3. Innate also agrees to give access to its online test / practice platform as a complementary, to the students of 2025 batch till the termination of this MoU
- 4. Student's performance analysis will be tracked then and there. A typical training day will consist of six hours of classroom sessions.
- 5. The students from each section would be split into multiple groups. The invoicing would be based on actual attendance as enumerated in point 14 below.
- Logistics -Accommodation of the trainers to be taken care of by Innate. Local Transport support alone would be provided by Saranathan.
- Tea/Coffee, snacks and lunch will be provided as a good will gesture at the campus on the days of training.
- 8. At the time of signing the MoU Innate to provide Master Plan/Execution Plan (Details of the program).
- 9. To facilitate and supervise the smooth and hassle-free delivery of the program both the parties will intimate each other the name of the Single Point of Contact (SPoC). Any deviation from the agreed program will have to be based on discussion and agreement between the SPoCs.
- The batch strength agreed to is 40 students. Minor variations to this number would be accepted. Any
  other change in class strength has to be based on discussion and mutual agreement between the two
  SPoCs.
- 11. A preliminary test for both soft skills and technical training will be conducted for the students and classification will made based on their scores. Based on the same the rate of coverage and in-depth focus would change, and, it is very important that the syllabus coverage is mandatory for all the batches.
- 12. For billing purposes, if the class attendance is less than 40 and classes cannot be clubbed/ combined, an average count of 30 will be taken for billing.
- 13. At the time of signing the MoU, Innate will submit a list of trainers, their resumes highlighting their experience in this field. The trainers are expected to have very high communication skills specially in English.
- 14. Based on feedback Innate should be capable of replacing a trainer or trainers from one day to the other.
- 15. Attendance taking is compulsory for every session. A session is defined as that period between two breaks. The attendance details should be available within the first 15 minutes of the session.
- 16. Only the students who have a minimum attendance of 75% (for the overall sessions) will be considered for invoicing. The average will be calculated based on the attendance of every day. This will be compiled and communicated to the vendor.
- 17. There is no minimum billing figure agreed upon.
- On the last day of the program there would be a post training on-line test to measure the effectiveness
  of the program.
- Innate agrees to continuously monitor students' performance based on continuous delegation of tests. The analysis report & recommendation for improvement will be submitted for the year 2024 (from February 2024 to December 2024)

20. Innate assures to provide additional platform for technical practice tests

#### 7. Compensation

- In consideration of the services (Training and Development) promises and performance of Innate, Saranathan agrees to pay as detailed in the Proposal, upon actual receipt of proper invoices, including time sheets, compensation upon the completion of each deliverable as specified in proposal. All invoices for the staggered payments would be submitted in any case on or before November 2024.
- 2. Saranathan agrees to pay in full (less applicable TDS) within 29 days of receipt of invoice for the service rendered by Innate
- 3. The payment would be staggered -

50% on completion of Technical Training,

Balance 50% on completion of Aptitude & Soft Skills Training

- 4. The amount agreed is Rs 4150 / student for the total 25 to 28 days program.
- 5. The rate is inclusive of all applicable taxes
- The rate is inclusive of handouts and materials (printed or otherwise) that would be required for the proper delivery of the training program.

#### 8. Infrastructure

Saranathan College of Engineering will provide the infrastructures of class rooms, auditoriums, access to playgrounds, projectors and computers as and when required for the training purposes.

#### 9. Rights in data, patents and copyright

Innate reserves all rights and authority for the contents, presentations, materials, preparatory materials, training documents shared/provided during the training programme. Any documents mentioned should not be shared/used/copied/modified for other purposes/ with other parties/ other departments without the written consent from Innate.

#### 10. Amendments or Modification

No amendment or modification to this MOU shall be effective against either party unless such an amendment or modification is set forth in writing and signed by both parties.

## <u>Headline:</u>

It was a two-day event, and the highlights of the same are given below

**<u>Resource Person:</u>** Dr. S. Sundar, Former Director, Gnanam School of Management, Sengipati, Thanjavur & Professor (Retd.,), BIM, Trichy, and Dr Anuradha, Industrial Consultant

# Day 1: (Highlights)

## Morning session:

- The morning session commenced with Dr. Sundar's captivating presentation, leaving a profound impact on the audience. His adeptness in presentation and interaction with the students set the tone for an engaging learning experience. Dr. Sundar provided valuable insights into effective self-introduction techniques tailored for interaction with higher officials and colleagues. Through meticulously designed group activities, all students actively participated, enhancing session attentiveness, and promoting diverse perspectives.
- Dr. Sundar's facilitation encouraged students to think critically and offered solutions to overcome challenging situations, fostering a supportive learning environment. Emphasizing the significance of soft skills, Dr. Sundar defined them as essential interpersonal abilities necessary for professional success. He imparted wisdom on

maintaining a friendly yet astute demeanor in the workspace and advocated for polite communication in the presence of higher authorities.

#### Afternoon session:

- Transitioning to the afternoon session, Dr. Anuradha delved into the intricacies of SRH.doc, highlighting the importance of clarity, consistency, and meticulousness in documenting client requirements. She provided comprehensive guidance on crafting resumes, stressing the integration of both technical and soft skills, alongside extracurricular activities, hobbies, and personal strengths. Dr. Anuradha underscored the necessity of accurately portraying technical proficiencies and interpersonal abilities, crucial for effective resume representation.
- Addressing interview preparation, Dr. Anuradha emphasized assertive communication and encouraged participants to openly express dissatisfaction and share impactful experiences. Dr. Sundar then led a discussion on interpersonal skills, illuminating their vital role in fostering effective business communication and nurturing trust and loyalty. He stressed the importance of comprehending individual preferences and weaknesses to amplify capabilities.
- An engaging activity preceded a discourse on mock interview strategies, culminating in the announcement of the forthcoming session dedicated to unravelling the secrets of cracking the GD round.

## Day 2: (Highlights)

### **Morning session:**

- The second day commenced with a dynamic group discussion facilitated by the trainers, focusing on thought-provoking topics such as 'learning and then doing vs. doing and then learning', and 'why re-released movies are receiving better reception than new movies'. Active participation and insightful questions enriched the session, fostering an environment conducive to diverse opinions and stimulating dialogue.
