SJECE TECHNICAL JOURNALS AUTHOR GUIDELINES

1. Always check the latest "Instructions for Authors" document available in the department website

2. The authors should strictly avoid copying work from other sources. Each manuscript is checked for plagiarism and if the manuscript fails in the plagiarism test, the manuscript will be rejected in the initial stage itself without further review.

3. Original work doesn't implies that the work should be new, but it implies that,

- All simulation results (if any) included in the manuscript should have been simulated by the authors
- All figures should have been drawn by the authors
- All the text must have written by their own by the authors

4. Manuscripts must be submitted electronically via the email: <u>ejournal-</u> <u>ece@saranathan.ac.in</u>. It is mandatory to submit your original work in Microsoft Word format (.DOC or .DOCX). The desirable maximum length of a paper is 6 pages.

5. The number of authors for each manuscript is restricted to a maximum of four

6. There is a template that authors must follow:

Papers should be arranged in the following order: Title; Author(s) (including year, Department, and organization); Abstract; Keywords; Notation (if any); Introduction; Main text; Conclusions; Acknowledgements (if any); References; Appendices (if any). Do not use more than 200 words in the abstract.

The recommended fonts are given in Table 1.

TABLE 1 THE RECOMMENDED FONTS

- Headings and subheadings should be numbered, eg. 1 Heading, 1.1 Subheading, 1.1.1 Sub-subheading, etc.
- Figures are numbered consecutively, eg. Figure 1: caption, Figure 2: caption, etc. and Fig. X in the text. Figures can be placed within the text near where they are first referred.

- All the figures must be referred inside the text
- Tables should be numbered consecutively in separate series, eg. Table 1: caption, Table 2: caption, etc. Tables can be placed within the text near where they are first referred.
- All the tables should be referred inside the text
- Appendices should be lettered, eg. Appendix A, Appendix B, etc.
- Equations should be numbered consecutively as they appear in the text and be referred to by their number, eg. equation (1), equation (2), etc.
- All the equations should be typed using equation editor in MS word
- All the equations should be referred within the text
- All the symbols and notations used in the equation should be clearly defined in the text

7. Number the citations consecutively, in square brackets [1]. Multiple references [1], [2] and [3], should be cited [1-3]. Also, use [4],[6-8] and not [4],[6],[7],[8]. In sentences, refer simply to the reference number, as in [3]. Do not use "Ref. [3]" or "reference [3]" except at the beginning of a sentence: "Reference [3] shows".

8. Avoid using the words we, I, and us etc...Use reporting language wherever possible.

9. If any graph is shown in the figure, the graph should contain the legend for axis.

10. If more than one curve is drawn in a single axis, there should be a legend for each curve

- 11. The x-axis and y axis should be numbered, and should be clearly visible to the reader
- 12. All the waveforms and figures should have good clarity
- 13. All the numbers in any waveform plot should be clearly readable
- 14. There should be a detailed caption for each figure and table

Each technical paper received for publication in the SJECE is reviewed by at least two independent reviewers of editorial panel. The editorial panel considers the reviews and decides whether or not a paper is to be accepted, revised and resubmitted, or rejected. If accepted, a copy of the manuscript will be returned to the author together with the comments by reviewers and editors, and instructions for the preparation of the camera ready copy.

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
